Mackinac Island

is a summer resort in Mackinac county, northern Michigan, U. S. It is situated in Lake Huron near the Straits of Mackinac and has ferry connections to St. Ignace and Mackinaw City, on Michigan's Upper and Lower peninsulas, respectively. The island, eight miles (13 km) in circumference and thickly forested, has been a state park since 1895. It retains an 18th and 19th century atmosphere; automobiles are banned, and horses and buggies and bicycles are used for transport.

Room rates for island view start at \$249 (plus tax) per night for weekday, rising to \$409 for weekends. Balcony rooms also available for additional fee.

YOUR TRIP TO MACKINAC ISLAND STARTS AT THE FERRY DOCK

There's no bridge to Mackinac Island and there are no cars allowed anyway, so you can't drive all the way there. One option for getting to Mackinac Island is by plane on a brief 7-minute charter flight from the mainland. Another option for getting to Mackinac Island is by private boat. **Most visitors arrive via ferry.**

The ferries depart from both **Mackinaw City**, at the northern tip of the Lower Peninsula, and **St. Ignace**, at the southern tip of the Upper Peninsula. It's there where visitors typically leave their cars for the length of their stay on Mackinac Island.

Arriving By Car to the Ferry Docks 🚘

- From the south, take I-75 to the ferry docks in either Mackinaw City or St. Ignace.
- From the north, take I-75 or U.S. 2 to the ferry docks in either St. Ignace or Mackinaw City.

Arriving By Air

The closest regional airport to Mackinaw City is Pellston Regional Airport (PLN) with daily flights from Detroit via Delta Airlines.

Transportation to/from PLN to the Ferry Docks is by shuttle or taxi. Ground Transportation Information can be found on the Pellston Regional Airport website at <u>www.pellstonairport.org</u>

Ferry Companies



Both **Shepler's Mackinac Island Ferry** and Star Line - now known as **Mackinac Island Ferry Company** offer boats to Mackinac Island and back from about every 30 minutes from late April through the end of October. The ferry ride takes about 20 minutes from either Mackinaw City or St. Ignace. Your luggage will come on the ferry to Mackinac Island with you, and you also may bring your own bicycle on board if you wish. Once your ferry boat arrives at Mackinac Island, you can retrieve your luggage and bring it to your place of lodging. Mackinac Island Taxi service is available. Some places to stay (including the Lilac Tree Suites) have dock porters take care of your luggage for you and bring it from the ferry docks to your room.
